

Careers Education Policy

Rationale

Careers Education is an essential part of the preparation of all students for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of adult life. It should help them to be informed of their own continuing education and training and about possible career paths. It is our expectation that all students should leave the school and move on to either Further/Higher Education or training or other career opportunities.

Aims

The Careers Education at Leicester Community Islamic School Leicester is aimed at developing the following:

- To make informed decisions now and for the future drawing on self-knowledge.
- To make informed decisions now and for the future by making effective use of information and guidance.
- To develop and demonstrate key and employability skills.

Outcomes

By the end of the following Key Stages all the students will:

KS3

- Have a greater awareness of themselves (qualities, abilities, weaknesses, limitations).
- Know where the careers library is and have accessed some information there.
- Be aware of the implications of GCSE.

KS4

- Be aware of the options of post 16 and which of them might be suitable for them.

- Know where the careers library is and who the school careers co-ordinator is.

Post 16

- Know where the careers library is and who the school careers co-ordinator is.
- Have increased awareness of the options of post 18 and which of these are suitable.
- Have increased awareness of personal qualities.

Guidelines

Careers Education forms a part of the Citizenship programme.

The school library houses relevant information and Higher Education prospectuses. There is a wealth of information and advice for young people on the Connexions website which is www.connexions-leics.org. Students can access the Connexions website during internet sessions.

Leicester Community Islamic School will increase its careers education provisions as and when funding is available, including the installations of a range of careers software e.g. Kudos, b-live

The University and College open days, talks from informed people inside and outside the school, will give further access to information.

Procedures

The Citizenship teacher is also the careers co-ordinator and is responsible for the delivery of careers education.

Once a month the careers co-ordinator will give 45 minutes of careers education to each class.

Every member of staff when approached by students should respond by offering appropriate guidance and support.
